



By Degree Type, 1997-98 through 2001-02




## Degrees Conferred 2001–02 by Academic Unit and Degree Type



Duplicate headcount of students receiving more than one degree. Doctorate includes first professional degrees.


## Number of Students Graduated in 2001–02


### By Gender and Degree Type











# Grade Point Average Graduating Class of 2002


