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





## Enrollment by Gender and Student Level




#### By Residency\* and Student Level






#### All Students by Residency\* and Status






## International\* Student Enrollment Fall Term 1998 to Fall Term 2015

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



#### **Highlights**

- For Fall 2015, total enrollment was 29,576 students.
- When Fall 2014 and Fall 2015 are compared, the total enrollment increased by 690 students or 2.4% (from 28,886 to 29,576), the FTE increased by 1.8%, and the Student Credit Hours increased by 1.8%.
- $\blacksquare$  The number of part-time students increased by 9.6% (from 6,834 to 7,489).
- When compared to Fall 2014, the undergraduate enrollment increased by 709 students, or 3.0% (from 23,903 to 24,612); the graduate enrollment decreased by 0.6% (from 4,410 to 4,385); the first professional enrollment increased by 1.0% (from 573 to 579).
- When compared to Fall 2014, Oregon residents increased by 1.0%; non-resident increased by 4.7%; and international student enrollment increased by 3.9%.
- University Honors College had an enrollment of 1,020.
- INTO OSU had a total enrollment of 1,260: 641 in Academic English program, 86 in INTO OSU General Pathways, 202 in INTO OSU Graduate Pathways, 16 in OSU-Student-Cap, 6 in Study Aboad, and 309 in Undergraduate Pathway program.

- The College of Engineering had the largest student enrollment (8.265) when compared to the other academic units.
- OSU Extended Campus had 10,148 students, an increase of 14.5% compared to Fall 2014. These students took 54,572 credits, of which 32.0% were from the College of Liberal Arts, while 17.0% were from the College of Engineering.
- The percentage of U.S. minority students was 22.8% of the total enrollment. The number of minority students increased by 6.9% when compared to Fall 2014 (from 6,320 to 6,754).
