







Enrollment by Sex—Binary and Student Level




By Residency* and Student Level













Highlights

- For Fall 2017, total enrollment was 30,896 students.
- When Fall 2016 and Fall 2017 are compared, the total enrollment increased by 542 students or 1.8% (from 30,354 to 30,896), the FTE increased by 1.1%, and the Student Credit Hours increased by 1.2%.
- The number of part-time students increased by 7.4% (from 7,911 to 8,494).
- When compared to Fall 2016, the undergraduate enrollment increased by 511 students, or 2.0% (from 25,327 to 25,838); the the first professional enrollment increased by 7.0% (from 561 to 600).
- When compared to Fall 2016, Oregon residents decreased by 0.8%; non-resident increased by 5.5%; and international student enrollment increased by 0.8%.
- INTO OSU had a total enrollment of 898: 288 in Academic English program, 255 in INTO OSU Graduate Pathways, 6 in OSU-Student-Cap, 9 in Study Aboad, and 370 in Undergraduate Pathway program.

- University Honors College had an enrollment of 1,187.
- The College of Engineering had the largest student enrollment (8,932) when compared to the other academic units.
- OSU Extended Campus had 12,725 students, an increase of 13.1% compared to Fall 2016. These students took 70,003 credits, of which 29.4% were from the College of Liberal Arts, while 17.8% were from the College of Engineering.
- The percentage of U.S. minority students was 24.8% of the total enrollment. The number of minority students increased by 6.3% when compared to Fall 2016 (from 7,204 to 7,660).
- The most popular undergraduate majors for Fall 2017 were: Computer Science Business Administration Mechanical Engineering Biology Kinesiology
