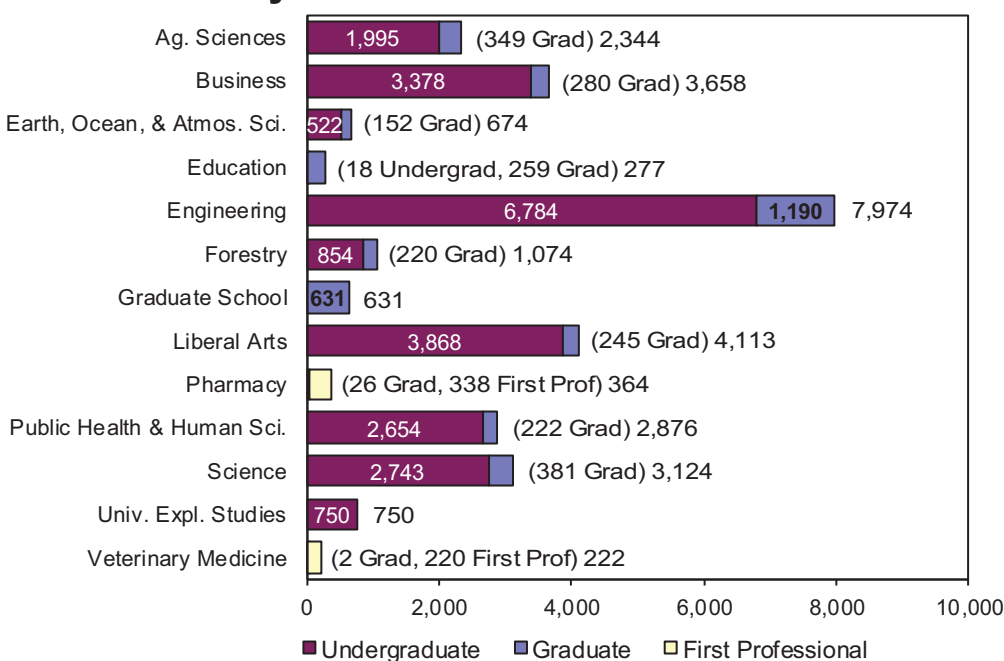

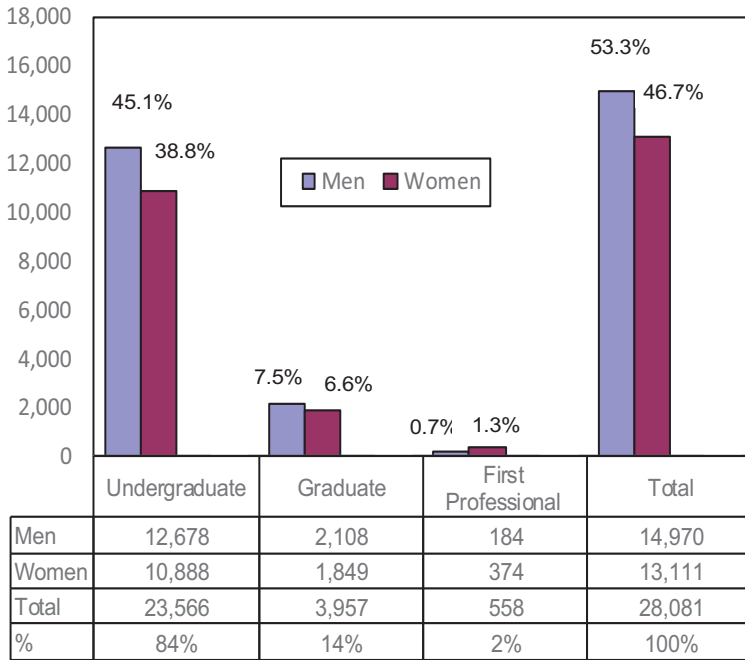

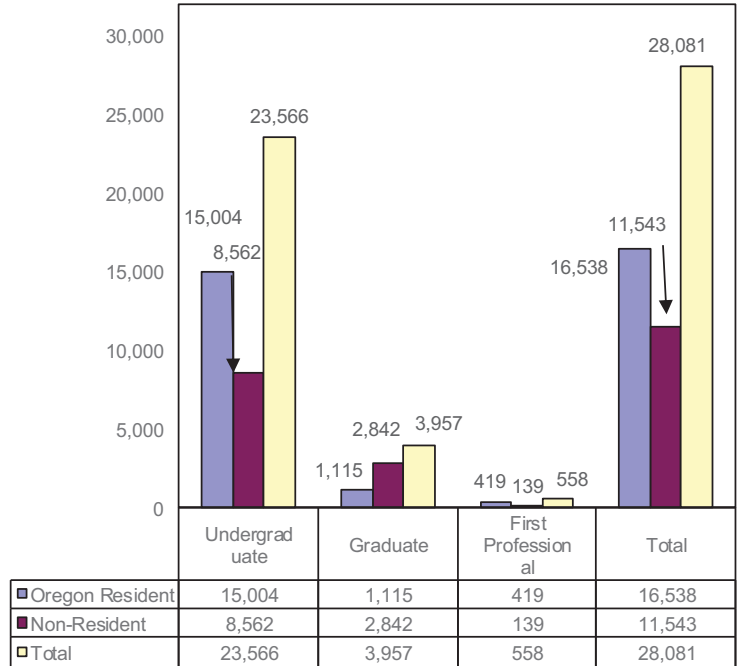

## By Residency\* and Student Level

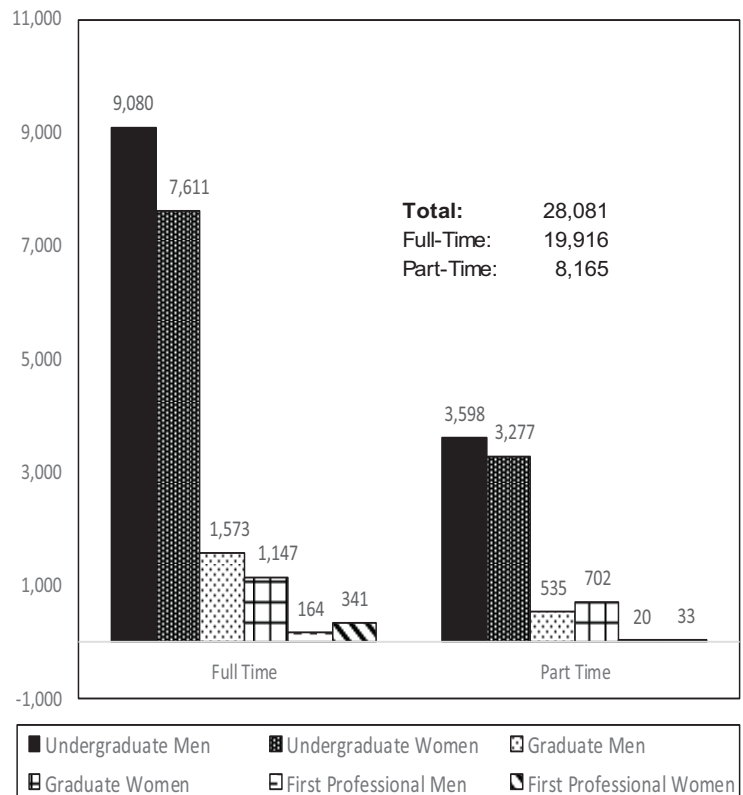

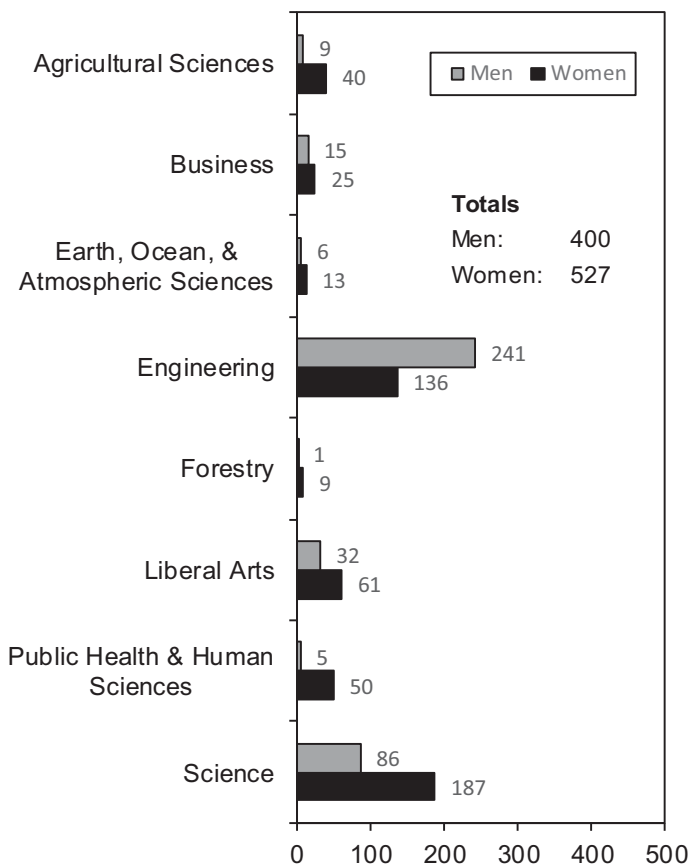

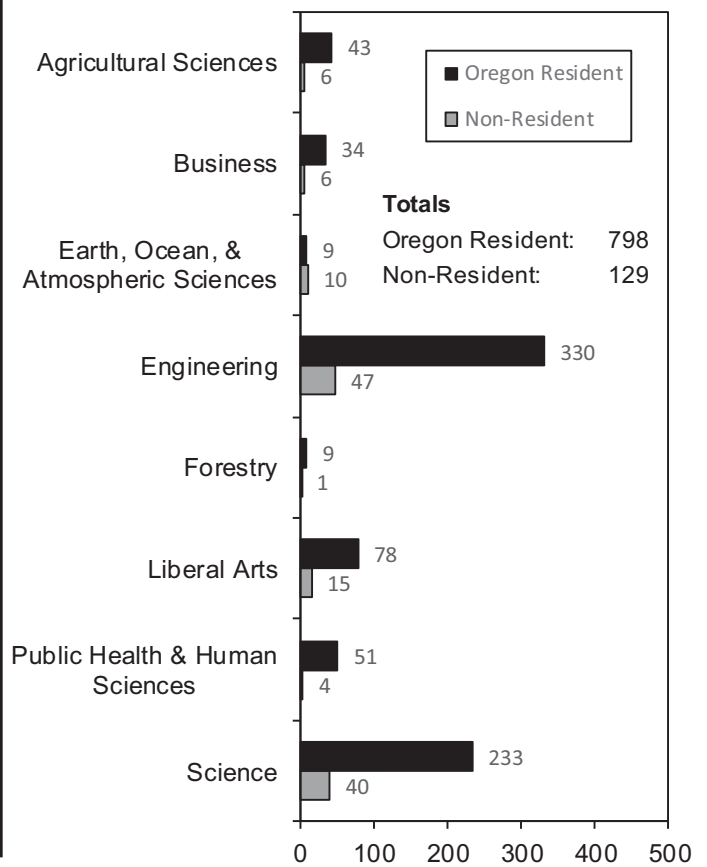

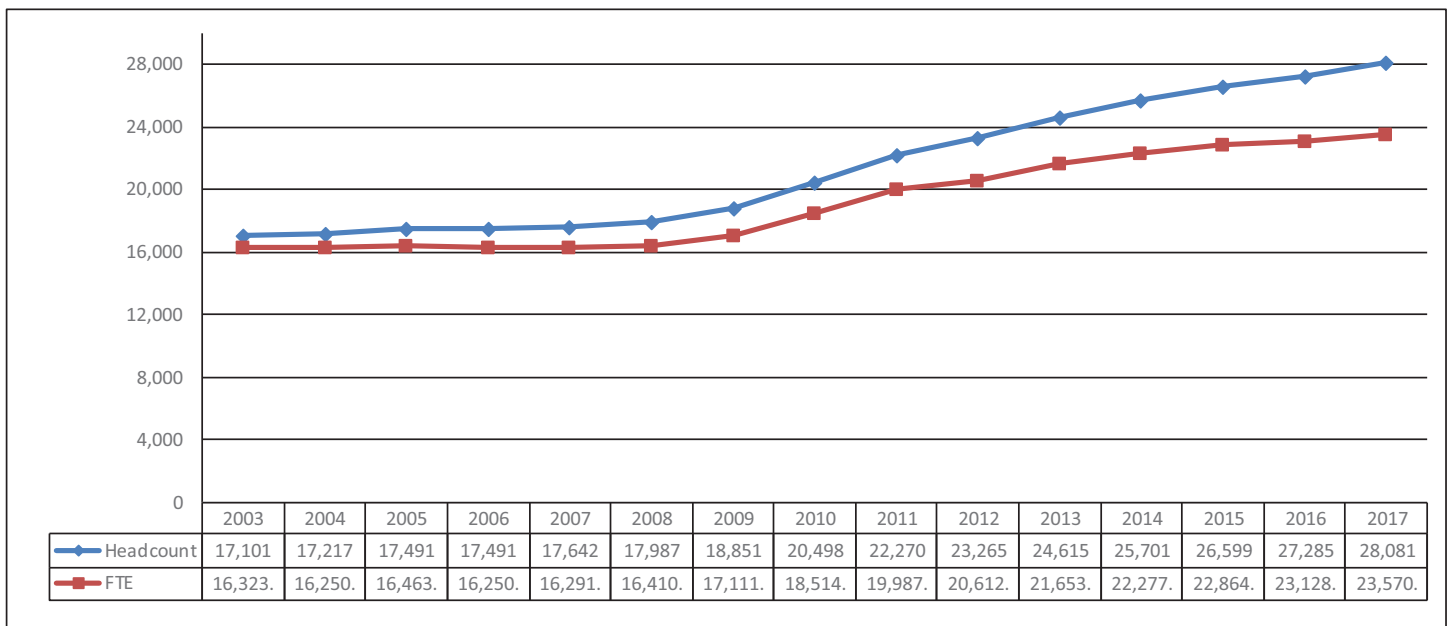

## Highlights

- When Spring 2016 and Spring 2017 are compared, the total enrollment increased by 796 students, or 2.9% (from 27,285 to 28,081). At the same time, the total student FTE increased by 441.7, or 1.9% (from 23,128.7 to 23,570.4), and the student credit hours increased by 6,653, or 2.0% (from 327,324 to 333,977).
- When compared to Spring 2016, the undergraduate enrollment increased by 766 students, or 3.4% (from 22,800 to 23,566); the graduate enrollment increased by 1.0% (from 3,916 to 3,957); the first professional enrollment decreased by 1.9% (from 569 to 558).
- When compared to Spring 2016, Oregon residents increased by 0.3%; non-residents increased by 7.0%.
- International student enrollment increased by 5.6%.
- For Spring 2017, the percentage of U.S. minority students was 24.1% of the total enrollment. The number of minority students increased by 7.4% when compared to Spring 2016 (from 6,303 to 6,772).
- The College of Engineering, College of Liberal Arts, and College of Business had the largest student enrollments (7,974, 4,112, and 3,659 respectively) when compared to the other academic units.

- OSU Extended Campus had 12,475 students, an increase of 14.0% compared to Spring 2016. These students took 67,720 credits, of which 30.3% were from the College of Liberal Arts, while 17.7% were from the College
- During Spring 2017, a total of 1,084 students received services from OSU Cascades Campus.
- Other increases that occurred when comparing Spring 2016 and Spring 2017 are as follows:
  - Part-time students: 9.7%
  - Undergraduate students age 25 and older: 6.4%
  - Male students: 3.4%
  - First Professional students under age 25: 3.2%
  - Undergraduate students under age 25: 2.5%
  - Female students: 2.4%
  - Graduate students age 25 and older: 1.4%
  - Full-time students: 0.4%
- Other decreases that occurred when comparing Spring 2016 and Spring 2017 are as follows:
  - First Professional students 25 and older: -4.5%
  - Graduate students under age 25: -0.1%
