





Highlights

- The Summer Session 2015 total enrollment of 12,418 was 779 more than Summer 2014 - an increase of 6.7%.
- There were more male students than female students in Summer 2015. Female students accounted for 49.8% of total students, while male students accounted for 50.2%.
- 78% of students were enrolled on a part-time basis.
- The College of Engineering had the largest unduplicated student enrollment (3,072) when compared to the other academic units.
- About(50.8%.) of the total student credit hours (88,079) were from College of Liberal Arts (26.4%.) and the College of Science(24.4%.).
- OSU Extended Campus had a total enrollment of 7,270 students. These students were enrolled for 38,749 credit hours. About 34.% of those credit hours were from the College of Liberal Arts.
- 107 new undergraduate students from high school enrolled for courses.
- The percentage of U.S. minority students was 22.6%.

- For Summer 2015, more students (6,147) enrolled in the Eight Week Session (June 22 - August 14). The Eleven Week Session (June 22 - September 4) had 4,581 students (second-largest enrollment).
