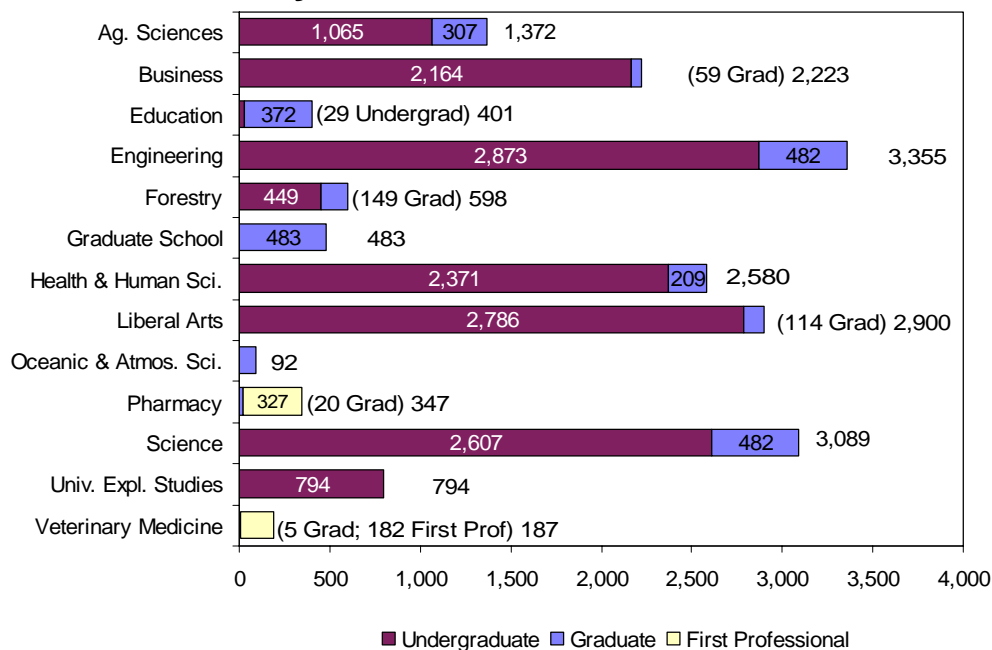

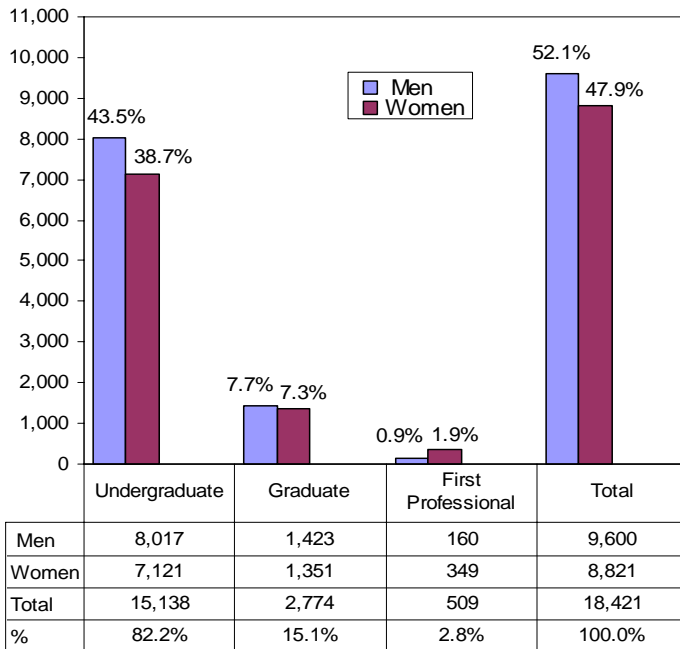

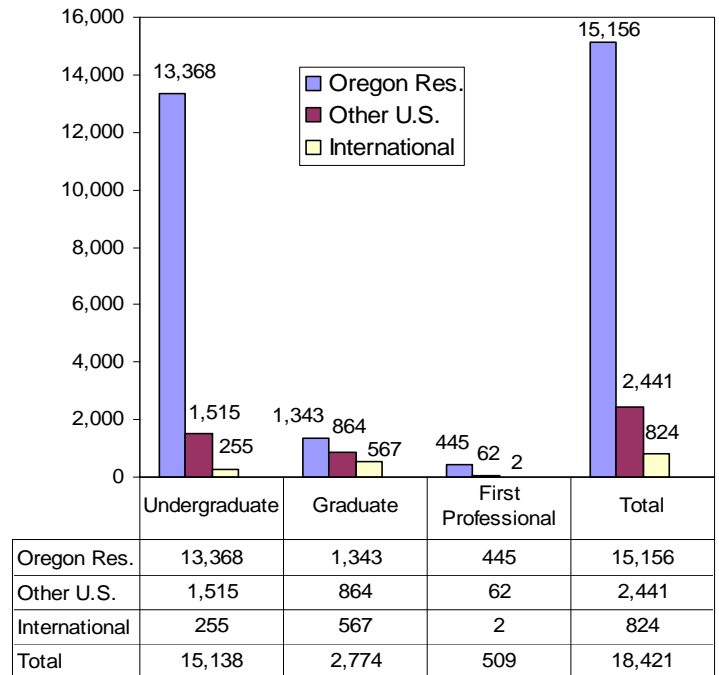

By Residency* and Student Level

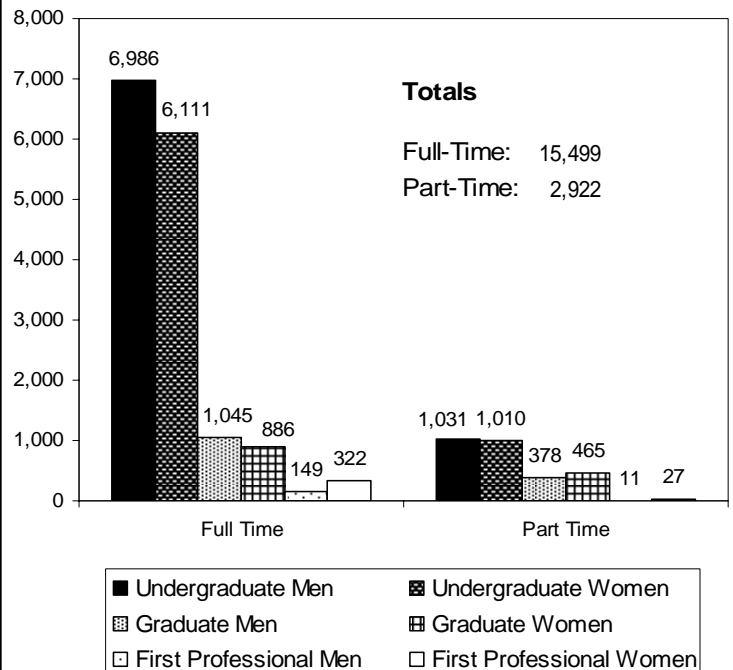

Student Enrollment Full Time and Part Time, by Gender

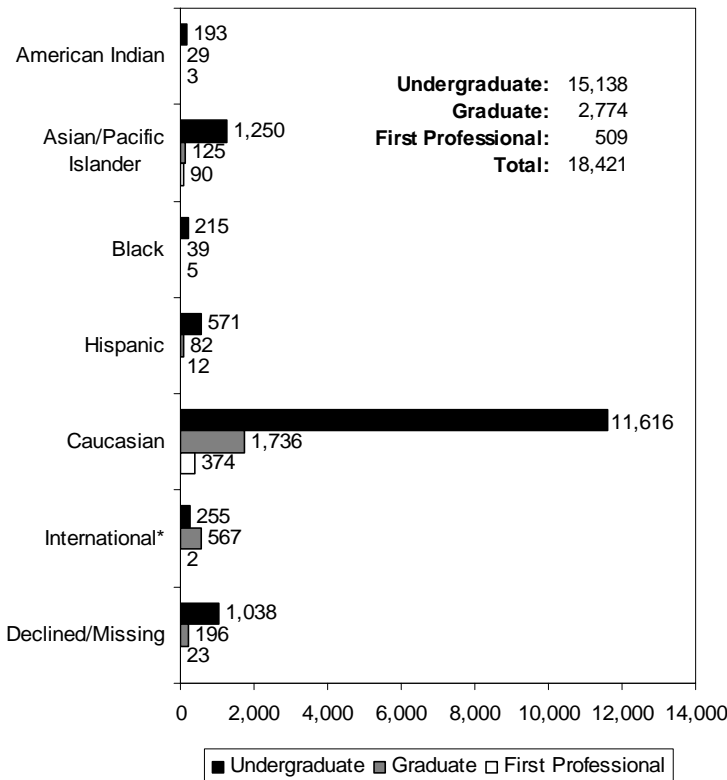

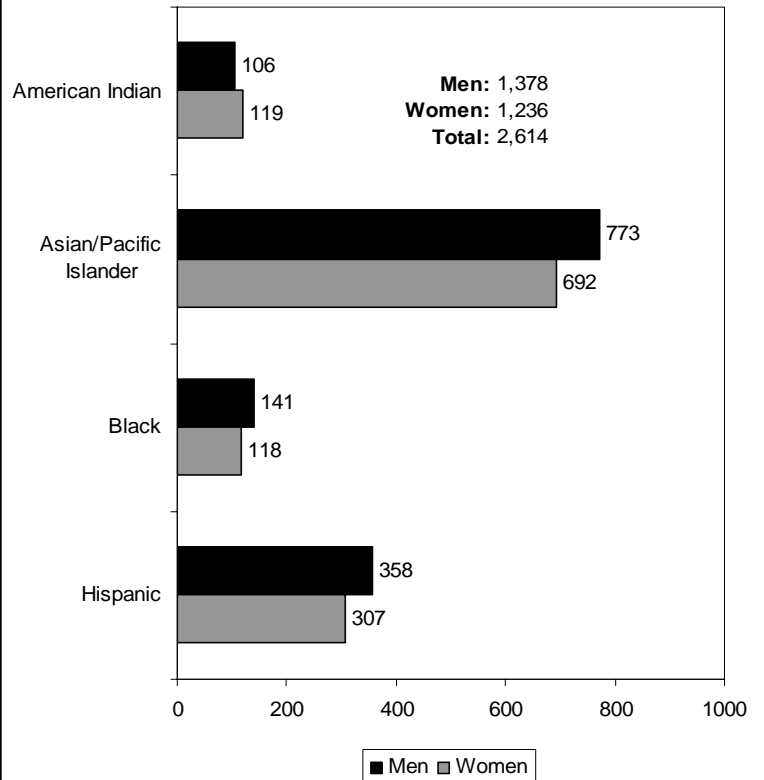

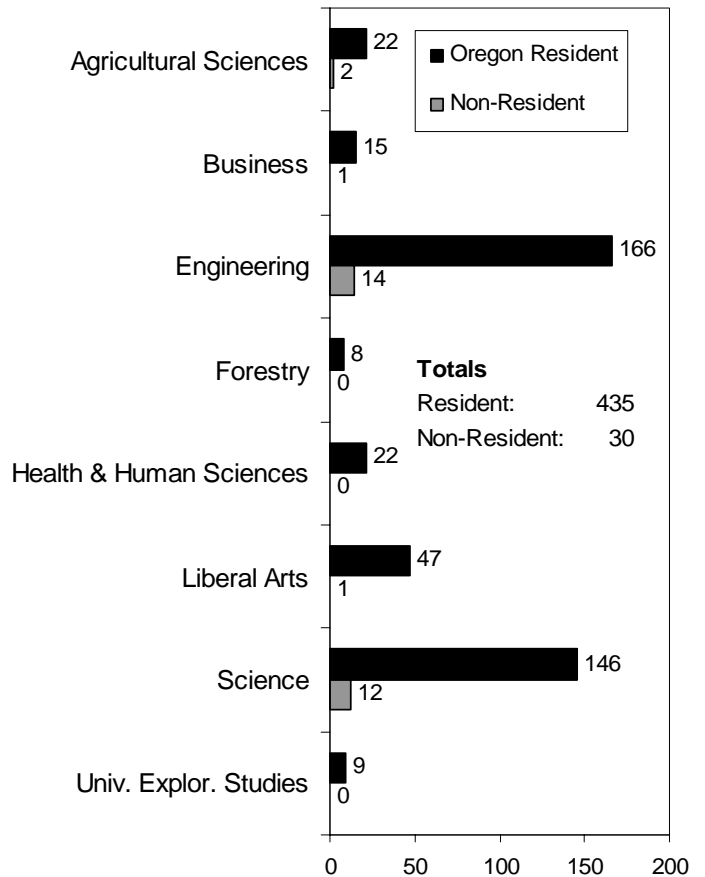

Highlights

■ When Winter 2005 and Winter 2006 are compared, the total enrollment decreased by 23 students, or -0.1% (from 18,444 to 18,421). At the same time, the total student FTE decreased by 245.1, or -1.4% (from 17,526.0 to 17,280.9), and the student credit hours decreased by 4,031, or -1.6% (from 248,950 to 244,919).

■ When compared to Winter 2005, the undergraduate enrollment decreased by 39 students, or -0.3% (from 15,177 to 15,138); the graduate enrollment decreased by 1.6% (from 2,819 to 2,774); the first professional enrollment increased by 13.6% (from 448 to 509).

■ When compared to Winter 2005, Oregon residents decreased by 0.1%; students from other U.S. states increased by 1.8%; and international student enrollment decreased by 6.6%.

■ For Winter 2006, the percentage of U.S. minority students was 14.2% of the total enrollment. The number of minority students increased by 2.6% when compared to Winter 2005 (from 2,548 to 2,614).

■ The College of Engineering, College of Science, and College of Liberal Arts had the largest student enrollments (3,355, 3,089, and 2,900 respectively) when compared to the other academic units.

■ OSU Extended Campus had 2,549 students, an increase of 25.7% over Winter 2005. These students took 10,315 credits, of which 43.1% were from the College of Liberal Arts, while 20.2% were from the College of Science.

■ During Winter 2006, a total of 584 students received services from OSU Cascades Campus.

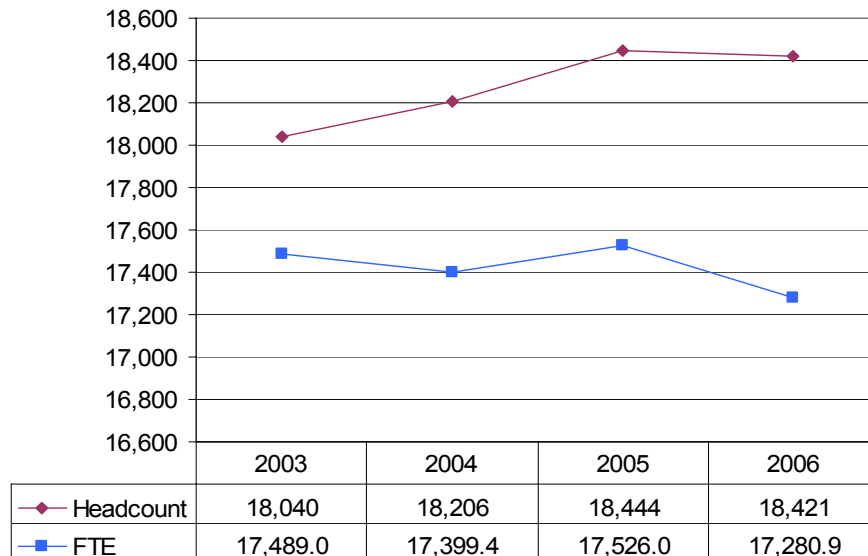
■ Other increases that occurred when comparing Winter 2005 and Winter 2006 are as follows:

- First Professional students 25 and older: 15.6%
- Part-time students: 11.3%
- First Professional students under age 25: 10.1%
- Undergraduate students age 25 and older: 2.2%
- Female students: 0.5%

■ Other decreases that occurred when comparing Winter 2005 and Winter 2006 are as follows:

- Graduate students under age 25: -5.3%
- Full-time students: -2.0%
- Male students: -0.7%
- Graduate students age 25 or older: -0.6%
- Undergraduate students under age 25: -0.6%
