





#### By Residency\* and Student Level







#### **Highlights**

- When Winter 2014 and Winter 2015 are compared, the total enrollment increased by 783 students, or 2.9% (from 26,963 to 27,746). At the same time, the total student FTE increased by 375.6, or 1.6% (from 23,827.3 to 24,202.9), and the student credit hours increased by 5,279, or 1.6% (from 337,399 to 342,678).
- When compared to Winter 2014, the undergraduate enrollment increased by 620 students, or 2.8% (from 22,351 to 22,971); the graduate enrollment increased by 4.3% (from 4,032 to 4,204); the first professional enrollment decreased by 1.6% (from 580 to 571).
- When compared to Winter 2014, Oregon residents decreased by 0.1%; non-residents decreased by 8.1%.
- International student enrollment increased by 9.6%.
- For Winter 2015, the percentage of U.S. minority students was 21.9% of the total enrollment. The number of minority students increased by 9.7% when compared to Winter 2014 (from 5,532 to 6,069).
- The College of Engineering, College of Liberal Arts, and College of Business had the largest student enrollments (7,449, 3,718, and 3,332 respectively) when compared to the other academic units.

- OSU Extended Campus had 9,188 students, an increase of 14.9% compared to Winter 2014. These students took 47,669 credits, of which 32.9% were from the College of Liberal Arts, while 16.8% were from the College of Engineering.
- During Winter 2015, a total of 1,116 students received services from OSU Cascades Campus.
- Other increases that occurred when comparing Winter 2014 and Winter 2015 are as follows:


