





#### By Residency\* and Student Level







### **Highlights**

- When Winter 2018 and Winter 2019 are compared, the total enrollment decreased by 185 students, or 0.6% (from 28,952 to 29,767). At the same time, the total student FTE decreased by 198.0, or 0.8% (from 25,400.7 to 25,202.7), and the student credit hours decreased by 2,971, or 0.8% (from 360,128 to 357,157).
- When compared to Winter 2018, the undergraduate enrollment decreased by 326 students, or 1.3% (from 25,049 to 24,723); the graduate enrollment increased by 2.7% (from 4,305 to 4,421); the first professional enrollment increased by 4.2% (from 598 to 623).
- When compared to Winter 2018, Oregon residents decreased by 3.2%; non-residents increased by 2.8%.
- International student enrollment decreased by 3.4%.
- For Winter 2019, the percentage of U.S. minority students was 25.3% of the total enrollment. The number of minority students increased by 1.9% when compared to Winter 2018 (from 7,399 to 7,537).

- The College of Engineering, College of Liberal Arts, and College of Business had the largest student enrollments (8,703, 4,090, and 3,924 respectively) when compared to the other academic units.
- OSU Extended Campus had 14,154 students, an increase of 5.8% compared to Winter 2018. These students took 78,887 credits, of which 29.9% were from the College of Liberal Arts, while 16.3% were from the College of Agriculture.
- During Spring 2018, a total of 1,180 students received services from OSU Cascades Campus.
- Other increases that occurred when comparing Winter 2018 and Winter 2019 are as follows:

• Part-time students: 1.1%

• Female students: 1.3%

■ Other decreases that occurred when comparing Winter 2018 and Winter 2019 are as follows:

• Full-time students -1.3%

• Male students: -1.9%
